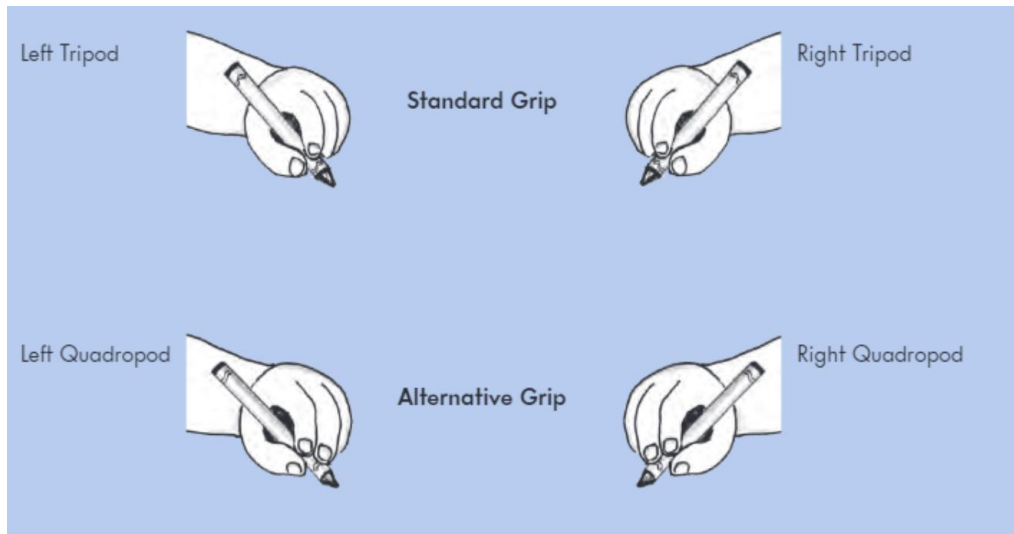


# Going on a Bear Hunt Coloring Activity

## Parent-Led Activity

### 1. Pick up

- Explicitly instruct your child how to pick up and grip the crayon correctly.

## Crayon Song

Pick up a crayon, Pick up a crayon,

## 2. Aim and Scribble

- AIM: Tell you child to pick up their crayon, hold it properly, and then AIM the crayon at the Bear.
- SCRIBBLE: Cue your child to begin. Allow coloring for 10-15 seconds.
- They say, "FREEZE!" have them stop coloring and drop their crayon. Then, cue them to pick their crayon back up and reposition the crayon with a proper grip before coloring again.

## 3. Aim and Color

- Have your child AIM and COLOR pictures on the attached coloring pages. You are prompting coloring skills while practicing their correct grip.
- Some children may only be attentive to or have enough endurance to color a one or two pictures at one sitting. Adjust for success!

Tip: Children can stand and color vertically or you can use a 4-inch binder to create a slant board.



Tip: You can have your child use finger paint or marshmallows to paint the pictures.
