

Going on a Bear Hunt Sensory Activity

How to Make Going On a Bear Hunt Sensory Bags

Materials:

1. Ziploc baggies
2. tape (I would highly recommend duct tape!)
3. different materials to go along with the book

Make one bag with long wavy grass with some grass from outside or use an old Christmas garland and cut the bristles.



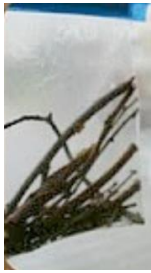
Make a second bag, for the cold river use some water with blue food coloring.



Make a third bag, for the mud, dig up dirt from outside and add water to it.



Make a fourth bag, for the forest, pick up some broken twigs from outside.



Make a fifth and final bag, for the snow storm, with powder sugar. (You can add some cold ice to a bag, if using while listening to the story).

You may wish for your child to touch the inside content of each bag as they listen to the story. You can hang up the bags on the window, by taping them with painter's tape, so your child can explore touching the bags.

Make sensory bottles:

From Left to Right:

- Grass - green shredded paper
- River - water with food coloring, oil and blue glitter
- Mud – dirt with water
- Forest - twigs and leaves
- Snowstorm – cotton and white rice for the sound effects
